## Kansas Speedway:

## <u>History</u>

- Groundbreaking for Kansas Speedway was held on May 25, 1999.
- The official opening of Kansas Speedway was in 2001, with the first events being an ARCA Menards Series race and a NASCAR K&N Pro Series West race on the same day June 2.
- The first Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series race was on Sept. 30, 2001 won by Hendrick Motorsport's **Jeff Gordon** (Chevrolet).
- During the 2012 season, between the April and October events, the 1.5-mile track underwent a repave, adding variable banking in the corners.
- There have been 26 Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series races at Kansas Speedway, one event from 2001 2010 and two races per year since 2011.

## <u>Starts</u>

- A total of 136 different drivers have competed in at least one Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series race at Kansas Speedway; 108 drivers have competed in more than one.
- Three drivers have started all 26 Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series races and lead the series in starts at Kansas Speedway Kevin Harvick, Kurt Busch, and Ryan Newman.
- Four drivers all-time have made their first Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series career start at Kansas Speedway: Erik Jones (5/09/2015), Ryan Blaney (5/10/2014), Austin Dillon (10/09/2011) and Denny Hamlin (10/09/2005).
- **Jason Leffler** (three starts) leads the Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series in average starting position at Kansas Speedway with a 3.500.
- **Joey Logano** (19 starts) leads all active drivers in the Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series in average starting position at Kansas with a 9.632.
