Today's Winner: Matt Kenseth

Team: No. 17 DeWalt Ford

- Matt Kenseth won the GFS Marketplace 400 at Michigan International Speedway, scoring his 13th NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victory in his 243rd career start.
- This was **Kenseth's third victory** in 2006. He also won at California and Dover.
- Kenseth moved into 46th on NASCAR's all-time winners list tied with Tim Richmond and Dick Rathmann.
- Kenseth scored his second victory at Michigan International Speedway and 11th victory on a superspeedway. His last victory at Michigan came in June 2002.
- Kenseth won the race from **the third-place starting position.**
- Kenseth scored his **13th top-10** finish in 23 races this season.
- Kenseth remained second in the point standings, now 475 ahead of 11th-place Kasey Kahne.
- Kenseth led the most laps for the third time in 2006 and the first time since Chicagoland, five races ago.
- Kenseth led six times for 87 laps including the final 32 laps in the GFS Marketplace 400.
- This was team owner Jack Roush's **93rd NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victory**. Roush has scored **nine** NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victories at Michigan.
- Jack Roush Racing has won at least one race each season 1997-2006, 10 consecutive years.

Notebook Items

- **Jeff Gordon** (second) scored his 10th top-10 finish in 2006. It marked his 19th top-10 finish in 28 races at Michigan International Speedway. This is Gordon's **sixth runner-up finish at Michigan**. Gordon climbed from ninth to sixth in the point standings and is 99 points ahead of 11th place **Kasey Kahne**.
- **Tony Stewart** (third) scored his 13th top-10 finish in 2006. It was his 10th top-10 finish in 16 races at Michigan. Stewart climbed from seventh to fifth in the point standings, 127 points ahead of 11th place Kasey Kahne.
- **Kasey Kahne** (fourth) scored his 12th top-10 finish in 2006. It was his fourth top-10 finish in six races at Michigan. Kahne is now **49 points behind** 10th-place Dale Earnhardt Jr..
- Mark Martin (fifth) scored his 11th top-10 finish in 2006. It was his 27th top-10 finish in 42 races at Michigan International Speedway. Martin climbed from sixth to fourth in the point standings, 138 points ahead of 11th place Kasey Kahne.
- **Kevin Harvick** (11th) extended a **35-race streak** of running at the finish that began at California last September, the longest current streak. Harvick ended a streak of six straight top-10 finishes that began at Daytona in July.
- At least one of the Raybestos Rookie-of-the Year contenders has scored a top-15 finish in all 23 races this season. Reed Sorenson finished eighth and Denny Hamlin finished ninth, the seventh time in 2006 that two or more rookies finished in the top 10. For Hamlin it marked his 11th top-10 finish in 2006, the most among the rookie contenders.
- Kyle Busch (39th) ended a streak of eight straight top-15 finishes that began at Michigan in June.
- **Jeff Burton** (42nd) ended a streak of **16 straight top-15 finish** that began at Texas in April. Burton's last DNF came at Talladega in October 2005. Burton dropped from **fourth to ninth** in the point standings and is just 84 points ahead of 11th-place Kasev Kahne.
- Point leader **Jimmie Johnson** (13th today) has been ranked among the top 10 for **92 consecutive races**. He now leads second-place Matt Kenseth by just 58 points.
- The **10 caution periods set the record** for the most at Michigan since 1969. The previous record was nine caution periods set in five previous races.

HEADING TO BRISTOL

- Three races remain in the "Race to the Chase." Any driver leading the 11th-place driver by **381 points following Bristol** is guaranteed a spot in the Chase for the NASCAR NEXTEL Cup. **No driver** has clinched a spot in the Chase.
- Eleventh-place Kasey Kahne trails 10th place Dale Earnhardt Jr. in the point standings by just 49 points.
- Six of the top-11 drivers are separated by 35 points or less.
- 138 points separate fourth to 11th in the standings.
- **Eight drivers in the top-14** changed point's positions at Michigan International Speedway.
- Jeff Gordon and Kurt Busch lead all active drivers, each scoring five victories at Bristol.
- Kurt Busch in April scored Dodge's first victory at Bristol since Richard Petty won this race 61 races ago in 1975.
- Ryan Newman leads all drivers posting seven straight top-10 starts at Bristol, the longest current streak.
- Jeff Gordon has posted 26 straight top-15 starts in 27 races at Bristol. Seven of his last nine were on the front row.
- Greg Biffle has posted three straight top-10 finishes at Bristol, the longest current streak.
- Dale Earnhardt Jr. has posted six straight top-15 finishes at Bristol.
- **Jeff Gordon** leads all active drivers with a **4.962 starting average** in 27 races at Bristol.
- Greg Biffle has a 9.857 finishing average in his seven races at Bristol, leading all active drivers.
- The NASCAR NEXTEL Cup Leader bonus will be worth \$30,000 at Bristol.
