Today's Winner: Tony Stewart

Team: No. 20 Home Depot Chevrolet

- **Tony Stewart** won the Pepsi 400 at Daytona International Speedway, scoring his **26th** NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victory in his **265th** career start.
- Stewart climbed to **21st on NASCAR's all-time winners list** tied with **Fred Lorenzen**.
- Stewart scored his **second victory** in 2006. Stewart also won at Martinsville in April.
- This was Stewart's **second straight** Pepsi 400 victory. Stewart has scored nine top-10 finishes in the last nine restrictor-plate races, including six straight top-fives. This is Stewart's 15th **victory on a superspeedway.**
- Stewart won from the **second-place starting position**. One year ago he won this race from the Bud pole.
- This is Stewart's **second victory** and **ninth top-10 finish** in 16 races at Daytona. He has scored six top-10 finishes in the last six races at Daytona.
- Stewart scored his **ninth top-10** finish in 17 races this season.
- Stewart climbed from **seventh to fifth** in the point standings.
- Stewart led six times for 86 laps, including the final three in the Pepsi 400, leading the most laps for the fourth time in 2006. He has led the most laps in four of the last six restrictor-plate races.
- This is team owner Joe Gibb's 50th NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victory and his third at Daytona.
- Joe Gibbs Racing has won at least one race each season 1993-2006, 14 consecutive years.

Notebook Items

- **Kyle Busch** (second) scored his eighth top-10 finish in 17 races in 2006. It was his first top-10 finish in four races at Daytona. He climbed from 12th to eighth in the NASCAR NEXTEL Cup point standings.
- **Kurt Busch** (third) scored his sixth top-10 finish in 2006. It was his fourth straight top-10 finish extending a streak that began at Pocono. It is his fifth top-10 finish (all top fives) in 12 races at Daytona.
- **Boris Said** (fourth) scored his second top-10 finish in two races in 2006 both in the last two weeks. It was his first **top-10 finish** in three races at Daytona. He also led in his first race other than a road-course event.
- Matt Kenseth fifth) scored his 11th top-10 finish in 2006. This was his fifth top-10 in 14 races at Daytona.
- Kevin Harvick (ninth) extended a 29-race streak of running at the finish that began at California last September, the longest current streak.
- Ryan Newman finished 11th at Daytona and extended a streak of five straight top-15 finishes.
- **Jimmie Johnson** (32nd) remained first in the NASCAR NEXTEL Cup point standings, but is now **just eight points ahead** of second-place **Matt Kenseth**.
- Johnson has been ranked among the top 10 for **86 consecutive races**, tying **Darrell Waltrip** for eighth in consecutive races in the points top-10 since the current point system was established in 1975.
- At least one of the 2006 Raybestos Rookie-of-the Year contenders has scored **a top-15 finish** in all 17 races this season. Clint Bowyer finished 10th, posting his fourth top-10 finish in 2006 including both races at Daytona.
- The **15 different leaders** in the 2006 Pepsi 400 is a record for this event.

Streaks that Ended at Daytona

- Greg Biffle (31st) dropped from ninth to 11th in the point standings and ended a streak of seven straight top-10 finishes, the longest top-10 streak of his career that began at Richmond in May.
- Denny Hamlin finished 17th at Daytona and ended a streak of seven straight top-15 finishes.

Heading to Chicagoland

- **Twenty-two drivers** competed in all five races at Chicagoland Speedway.
- There have been five different Bud Pole winners in the five races at Chicagoland.
- Kevin Harvick is the only repeat race winner at Chicagoland, scoring back-to-back victories. Harvick won the inaugural race
 in 2001 and then won again there in 2002.
- Greg Biffle has posted top-10 starts in all three of his races at Chicagoland.
- **Jimmie Johnson** and **Tony Stewart** have each posted **top-five finishes in the last four races** at Chicagoland Speedway. They are the only drivers with four top-five finishes there.
- **Jimmie Johnson** leads all drivers with a **3.0 average finish** in his four races at Chicagoland Speedway.
- A Chevrolet has won four of the five races at Chicagoland Speedway. A **Dodge** won there in 2003. A Ford has never won at Chicagoland Speedway.
- Three of the five races at Chicagoland Speedway have been won from a starting position outside the top-10.
- No NASCAR NEXTEL Cup race at Chicagoland has ever been won from a top-five starting position.
- The NASCAR NEXTEL Cup Leader bonus will be worth \$90,000 at Chicagoland Speedway.
