Today's Winner: Denny Hamlin

Team: No. 11 FedEx Ground Chevrolet

- **Denny Hamlin** won the Pocono 500, scoring his **first** NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victory in his **21st** career start. This was Hamlin's first race at Pocono.
- Hamlin became the first rookie to win a NASCAR NEXTEL Cup race since **Kyle Busch** won at Phoenix in November 2005.
- Hamlin became the **ninth different race winner** in 2006. He scored his **sixth top-10** finish in 14 races this season. Hamlin has posted five straight top-15 finishes.
- Hamlin is the **30th first-time race winner** since 1994. There has been at least one first-time race winner in **12 of the last 13 years** (since 1994). There was no first-time race winner in 2004.
- This is the third time in 2006 that a race was won from the Bud Pole starting position. **Kasey Kahne** won two races from the Bud Pole (Texas and Atlanta).
- This marked the **10th race** at Pocono to be won from the Bud Pole.
- Hamlin led the most laps for the first time in his career.
- Race winner Hamlin led six times for 83 laps, including the final 24 laps.
- This was team owner **Joe Gibb's 49th NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victory**. Gibbs has scored **his fifth** NASCAR NEXTEL Cup victories at Pocono Raceway.
- Joe Gibbs Racing has won at least one race each season 1993-2006, 14 consecutive years.

Notebook Items

- This is the **182nd victory by a No. 11** car in NASCAR history. The last time the No. 11 won was with **Bill Elliott** in the Junior Johnson-owned Ford in September 1994 at Darlington.
- Kurt Busch (second) scored his third top-10 and second top-five finish in 2006. It is his fifth top-five finish in 11 races at Pocono Raceway.
- **Tony Stewart** (third) scored his eighth top-10 finish in 14 races in 2006. It is his first top-10 finish in the last four races. Stewart climbed from **fifth to fourth** in the NASCAR NEXTEL Cup point standings. Stewart has scored 10 top-10 finishes in 15 races at Pocono Raceway.
- Brian Vickers (fourth) scored his fourth top-10 finish of 2006 and his second top-10 finish in five races at Pocono.
- Matt Kenseth (fifth) scored his 10th top-10 finish in 14 races in 2006. It is his **ninth top-five** finish in 2006. Kenseth has scored six top-10 finishes in 13 races at Pocono Raceway. He remained second in the point standings. **One year ago he ranked 24th** after 14 races.
- Four races ago Greg Biffle was 232 points behind 10th. With his sixth-place finish, Biffle is now 27 points behind 10th and is just two points behind 11th-place Jeff Gordon. He has climbed from 23rd to 12th in points since Talladega. After 14 races in 2005, he ranked second in the point standings. Biffle has scored five straight top-10 finishes, tying the longest top-10 streak of his career set one year ago between August and September.
- Jeff Burton (ninth) has climbed from 21st to 7th in the point standings since Martinsville. One year ago he ranked 17th in the standings after 14 races. Burton has scored four straight top-10 finishes, extending a streak that began at Darlington.
- Jimmie Johnson (10th) remained first in the NASCAR NEXTEL Cup point standings and is now just **48 points ahead** of second-place Matt Kenseth. Johnson has **lost 61 points** of his lead in the last two races. Johnson has scored top-15 finishes in **13 of the 14 races** in 2006.
- Mark Martin (17th) failed to score a top-15 finish for just the second time in 2006.
- At least one Raybestos Rookie-of-the Year contender has scored a top-15 finish in every race this season.
- Dave Blaney (27th) extended a 32-race streak of running at the finish the longest current streak.
- Heading to Michigan
 - Ryan Newman has posted top-15 starts in all nine of his races at Michigan. Seven were top-10 starts.
 - Jeff Gordon has posted four straight top-10 starts at Michigan, the longest current streak.
 - Matt Kenseth has scored top-10 finishes in his last six races at Michigan, the longest current streak among active drivers. Greg Biffle and Carl Edwards have each scored three straight top 10 finishes there.
 - Tony Stewart is the only non-Roush driver to score top-10 finishes in the last three races at Michigan.
 - Matt Kenseth has posted a top-15 finish in 12 of his 13 races at Michigan.
 - **A Dodge** has won three of the last five races at Michigan. A Ford has won five of the last eight races at Michigan. A Chevrolet has not won at Michigan since June 2001 (**Jeff Gordon**), 10 Michigan races ago.
 - The last three races at Michigan have been won from a starting position outside the top-10, including this race one year ago that was won from 25th, the second lowest starting position of a race winner at Michigan.
 - The NASCAR NEXTEL Cup Leader bonus will be worth **\$60,000** at Michigan International Speedway.
